LONGFELLOW ELEMENTARY IS A TITLE I SCHOOLWIDE PROGRAM SCHOOL. Title I programs at each school will vary, depending on the needs of the school. Every child may benefit from the added services and programs that a School-wide Title I program can offer. A School-wide Program helps a school do more for all of its students.

OUR SCHOOL STAFF IS COMMITTED TO:

- Communicating with parents and students regarding academic progress, attendance and behavior through interim reports and report cards (4 each per year), parent/teacher conferences, (11/25/19, 11/26/19, 11/27/19, 2/13/20, and 2/14/20), Wednesday Folders (weekly), HCPSS News Alerts (ongoing), Grade level newsletters (quarterly), agenda book/homework folders (daily), notes/phone calls/emails, as needed. Interpreter services and translated documents are readily available.
- Offering parenting workshops and in-services on topics promoting the academic achievement of all students, as well as, information about MAP and MCAP assessments. A calendar of events will be sent home.
- Establishing a safe, responsible, and respectful learning environment (school-wide PBIS program).
- Providing high quality instructional and curricular experiences as we implement the Maryland College and Career-Ready Standards.
- **EXTENDED DAY OPPORTUNITIES:** Some of our children will qualify for an educational opportunity that extends beyond the regular school day. It is the BRIDGES Program, an after school program that focuses on math skills for students in grades 3-5. Students are involved in hands-on, engaging enrichment activities and receive academic support. BRIDGES is funded by a 21st Century CLC grant.

- To attend family programs, Back to School Night and Parent Teacher Conferences to help monitor your child's progress.
